HUBBELL CHILD DEAD

Lorencie Beaudette Passed Away After Three Day's Illness

Lorencie, the 10 year old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Amedie Beaudette of Hubbell died yesterday morning at 1:30 o'clock from appendicitis, after three days of sickness. From the time the child was stricken down with the disease she was a sufferer of the most excruciating pain.

The little girl was a bright child and a general favorite among her young companions with whom she mingled. She had a kind loving disposition and was very bright in her studies. Her death coming as it did after such a short illness makes it very hard for the parents to bear.

The funeral will be held tomorrow about 9 o'clock with services at St. Cecilia's church of Hubbell. Interment will be made in Mount Calvary cemetery at Lake Linden.
